# TSUULL Food Initiatives on Campus

We have a range of food initiatives for students and staff on-campus

## TSUULL Motto:

We Build Sustainability in Everything We Do.

In order to achieve Zero Hunger by 2030, the targets for SDG 2 include to end hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture.



### Community Garden

We create green spaces for students and staff, protect our natural environment. The garden is open to students, staff and neighbors, however most of the garden's volunteers are students who are interested in environmental sustainability issues such as composting and soil health, are looking to swap an hour's labor for some quality produce or want to connect with others



### Sustainability Walk

The whole year we made up for once per week and more than 60 sessions in total for more than 2500 students from four University faculties. A sort of guided walk that highlights sustainability at university. Certain activities are being carried out in the field of physical education and sports development among the youth.



### Charity for Low-Income Students

During 2022, various charity programs were carried out, one of the first was a traditional charity event. From the first days of the academic year, as an environmentally friendly University, a table set with food and non-plastic cutlery organized by Rector, Prof. Shuhrat Sirojiddinov for the students of the Campus.



### Focusing on Food Sustainability

Care for students is not forgotten during annual national holidays: Nowruz, considered as a UN-recognised New Year holiday was widely celebrated by the Rector and all academic staff in a Campus. During the festival in 2022, along with the national Uzbek dishes, a sumalak – a wheat bran pudding – was prepared and distributed to all the University members.



### Improving Nutrition and Promoting Sustainable Agriculture

Community assisted students and also to the local community. In order to improve nutrition and stop hunger, the first year Bachelor year students and the chairman of 'Tepa' district provided food products to the retired people of the local community around.



# TSUULL Commitment to Tackle Food Waste: Open Lectures

Low-income students face unique financial challenges in University which can make higher education seem out of reach. University provided open lectures and developed civic engagement among students completely for free. Online, offline and even international seminars have been delivered to educate students:

## Public-Talk...

'Compost is the Most! Digging Deep into Black Gold Magic' by the Independent Researcher, Permaculture Designer and Compost Fanatic (based in Chile). Together with students we looked at different types of compost, we analyzed the main practical mistakes and relaxed by inventing dozens of ways to use the resulting magnificent compost. Finally, we discussed the role of composting in a sustainable community and answered the question 'Is it just some rotting stuff in the backyard or a revolutionary act against consumer-driven society?'

with an Italian NGO 'Alterative' how in different countries individuals, communities and associations are protecting land, water, local culture and biodiversity generating models fostering socio-environmental justice, environmental sustainability and climate justice. They told students possible solutions **to enhance people's control over how food is grown** and what they are eating, balancing it with the environmental and social bottom lines, without further damaging the fragile Planet Earth that nourishes and sustains us.

## TSUULL as an Eco-Friendly Institution: Reducing the Use of Plastic Cutlery

Canteens opened for eating-in do not provide disposable plastic straws. Instead of them, we offer students cutlery: spoons, knives and forks with an intention to reduce plastic waste at University and to promote sustainable lifestyles among students and staff community by eliminating the plastic waste from food consumption.
